Outreach Committee Purpose Statement

The purpose of the Outreach Committee is to create and coordinate education, events, and engagement to forward the mission of the Western Slope Conservation Center.

- As outlined in the Board's 3-year Strategic Plan, WSCC will undertake events or provide services if:
 - 1) They advance WSCC's mission and are consistent with our values and goal areas
 - 2) Costs of the activity and potential sources of funding have been identified
 - 3) There is a clear and defined purpose for our involvement, whether solely or in partnership, without duplicating the efforts of other organizations
 - 4) There is evidence of a need for the events or activity
 - 5) There is a reasonable chance for success and a plan for evaluation based on outcomes and goals
 - 6) Consideration has been given to potential impacts/conflicts related to current programs, activities, and relationships
- WSCC's events over the course of the year should ensure the Conservation Center's ability to reach the entire Lower Gunnison Watershed, especially outside the North Fork Valley
- Tactics to engage the community should include a mix of:
 - Community events and festivals
 - "Lecture" series
 - Hikes
 - o Talks, preferably in fun places like a bar!
 - Happy hours
 - Volunteer work days
 - Social Media
